Survey of a facility's waste stream.

Sort items, record & analyze data.

Identify items thrown away, recycled or diverted, and sort by volume.

Learn how types of waste are managed

Waste reduction opportunities and disposal.



Waste Audits & School Curriculum

World Waste by The Numbers

We generate
2.01 billion
tonnes of
Municipal Solid
Waste/year.

33% not managed in environmentally safe manner. Global waste volume projected to double to 2.3 billion tonnes in 2025. Waste generation expected to grow to 3.40 billion tonnes by 2050.

United States of Waste

69 million tons were recycled.

That's 4.9lbs. of waste per person/day.

25 million tons were composted.

2018 total 292.4 million tons.

Disposal

4% of the world's population, producing 12% of the world's waste per year. Halpern, 2019



Impact of Developing Countries

Produce lower levels of waste.

Higher proportion (50%) organic.

Highest in developing island nations, where tourism plays a large role.

"Recyclables" from Developed Countries shipped across world overwhelming poorest nations.

What Happens to our Plastic

We generate 34.5m tons of plastic waste/year, enough to fill Giant's stadium1,000 times.

According to plastics industry, it goes to a factory to be transformed into something new.

100,000s of tons of US plastic shipped yearly to poorly regulated developing countries.

Found: Cheetos bags, Walmart aisle markers, plastic ShopRite bags from NJ supermarket, urging people to recycle.



Nguyễn Thị Hồng Thắm, a 60-year-old Vietnamese mother, living amid piles of grimy American plastic outside Hanoi is paid \$6.50 a day to "recycle" plastic.



































- Established 2015 by the United Nations and adopted by 193 countries.

- EPA aligns waste reduction goals to meet SDG goals' 2030 deadline.
- EPA Sets National Recycling Goal & Food Waste Reduction of 50% by 2030.


