October - November 2023 Education & Outreach Activities, as per the Annual Plan of Operations:

In support of OCSCD's Annual Plan of Operations (APO), which includes in its vision "to be recognized as a conservation leader", and includes in its mission "to protect, restore and sustain fully functioning soil resources...", "further natural resource stewardship through educational programs..." and "develop and nurture effective relationships... to sustain functioning ecosystem services...", the Education Department is championing the Jersey-Friendly initiative in cooperation with Barnegat Bay Partnership, to effectuate OCSCD's vision and mission. In addition, the Education Department is supporting the OCSCD technical staff on two additional grant projects: Sustainable Practices for Aquaculture Resource Conservation (SPARC) and Lakewood Township Stormwater Basin Retrofit Project. In addition, the Education Department continues to provide community outreach programs and statewide initiatives, as well as research and write grants to support OCSCD's overall mission.

Grant 2: Lakewood Township Stormwater Basins Retrofit Project

OCSCD is partnering with South Jersey Resource Conservation and Development Council (SJRC&D), Lakewood Township Department of Public Works, and the Camden County Soil Conservation District on a grant from the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection: Lakewood Township Stormwater Basin Retrofit Project. The grant is funded by a Federal 319(h) Water Quality Restoration grant awarded by the NJ Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) to SJRC&D.

- OCSCD's role is to implement and promote the Lakewood Township Stormwater Basin Retrofit Project, including
 education and outreach programs to bring awareness to the importance of the Basin Retrofit projects. Brittany
 Moore is the lead project coordinator on behalf of OCSCD and Becky Laboy is assisting and focusing primarily on
 the communications and education component. Read Ms. Moore's most recent blog post.
- 2. (APO Item #4, Activity 2) Seeks Grants and Funding to support both on-going and new initiatives and programs: Becky continues to research potential grants and opportunities that will support the District's Mission.
 - Becky submitted a proposal to the EPA Region 2 Environmental Education grant, on November 7. The project is titled: titled Cultivating Resilient Communities: Understanding Soil as a Climate Mitigation Tool.
 OCSCD's proposal was submitted in partnership with Natural Resource Education Foundation of New Jersey (NREF) and New Jersey Resources (NJR). The full Work Plan is attached. The brief Project Description states:

Cultivating Resilient Communities: Understanding Soil as a Climate Mitigation Tool empowers underserved Title I communities in Ocean County, New Jersey, fostering teacher expertise, climate-smart students, and community engagement. Our project employs a multi-focused approach to emphasize the role of soil as a powerful and dynamic resource for addressing climate-related issues, leading to student development of soilbased climate resilience (SBCR) projects. Professional development workshops, student field trips, and our culminating community-wide Student Summit are the cornerstones of our project. Workshops serve as fertile ground where 40 high school teachers grow their climate literacy. Educators are equipped with innovative instructional methods focused on local climate challenges and soil-driven solutions, using hands-on place-based interactive strategies and activities. Empowered teachers become vital catalysts in shaping ~1,000 climate-smart students. Field trips provide immersive experiences for ~500 students, who become rooted in their understanding of soil-based climate resilience practices by witnessing them firsthand. Collaboration with community leaders ensures an ecosystem of support towards a collective effort to drive behavioral changes and advocate for local climate resilience actions. A culminating Student Summit offers ~500 students the opportunity to share their climate resilience projects with the community. At the heart of our initiative lies the inspiring Lighthouse Center, a beacon of environmental innovation, where real-life examples come to the fore. Here, a living shoreline project stands as a testament to soil's ability to control erosion and absorb floodwater. Sustainable landscaping projects showcase their role in carbon sequestration and water filtration. Habitat restoration initiatives demonstrate the power of stabilized soil in support of biodiversity. Workshops, field trips and the Student Summit all take place at the Lighthouse Center. This project lays the foundation for a sustainable future.
