## June-July 2024, Bi-Monthly Education Report

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## June – July, 2024 Education & Outreach Activities, as per the Annual Plan of Operations:

In support of OCSCD's Annual Plan of Operations (APO), which includes in its vision "to be recognized as a conservation leader", and includes in its mission "to protect, restore and sustain fully functioning soil resources…", "further natural resource stewardship through educational programs…" and "develop and nurture effective relationships… to sustain functioning ecosystem services…", the Education Department continues to champion the Jersey-Friendly Yards initiative in cooperation with Barnegat Bay Partnership, to effectuate OCSCD's vision and mission. In addition, the Education Department is supporting OCSCD technical staff on the Lakewood Township Stormwater Basin Retrofit Project, is an active partner in the New Jersey Bay Islands Initiative, and offers support to the South Jersey Resource Conservation & Development Council (SJRC&D). The Education Department continues to provide community outreach programs and statewide initiatives, as well as research and write grants to support OCSCD's overall mission.

# (APO Item #1) IMPLEMENTATION OF CHAPTER 251 SOIL EROSION & SEDIMENT CONTROL ACT & OTHER NATURAL RESOURCE PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS

- **1. (APO Item #1, Activity 14)** Becky maintains the District Website. *(See also, APO Item #3, Activity 1 and APO Item #5, Activity 1)* 
  - Becky maintains and updates the District website with Chapter 251 SESC-related information, Education & Outreach information, and general updates.
  - In addition, Lisa Mazzuca of On Your Mark Website Design and Graphics is under contract with the District to provide website support, as needed.

## 2. (APO Item #1, Activity 17 and Sub-Task)

- Becky researches and supports funding opportunities for District Technical Staff to be trained in non-SESC programs and projects.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Sub-Task, #4, SJRC&D, 319h Basin Retrofit Grant Lakewood: Becky and Brittany Moore are working together on the Lakewood Stormwater Basin Retrofit Grant Project. We are moving forward with plans to execute the education component of the grant. Becky regularly attends the SJRC&D meetings.

- **2. (APO Item #3, Activity 3)** Becky participates in various training opportunities to enhance overall abilities as a District employee.
  - May 22: Becky attended professional development with NJ Department of Agriculture, "Sustainable Pathways in Farm to School", presented by Nicole Broadwater, held at the Burlington County Agricultural Center, Moorestown, NJ.
- **3. (APO Item #3, Activity 5)** Becky serves as OCSCD representative member of the Barnegat Bay Partnership's Communication and Education Committee (CEC)
  - Becky serves as the CEC Co-Chair for the current term. Becky is working with CEC Chair Joel Mott, NJ Pinelands Commission, Nina Sassano, Associate Director of Outreach, BBP, and Bailey Sanders, Stewardship Specialist, BBP,

- on the goals and objectives of the CEC Communication & Education Plan. We are currently planning our annual retreat, discussing dates in late summer or fall, and determining the location.
- Becky attends bi-monthly meetings of the CEC and reports on OCSCD's education initiatives related to National
  Estuary Program activities and goals, such as those specified in BBP's <u>CCMP</u> and <u>Communication Plan</u>. As CEC
  Co-Chair, Becky attends BBP Advisory Committee Meetings.
  - Sub-Task: The shared services agreement between OCSCD and BBP in support of Jersey-Friendly Yards / watershed stewardship was renewed on February 12, 2024, for a period of one year. (See APO Item #4, Activity 1.)

## (APO Item #4) EDUCATION INITIATIVES - GRANT RELATED

1. (APO Item #4, Activity 1) Becky continues to seek and expand granted projects when opportunities arise.

## Grant 1: Jersey-Friendly Yards (subcontract with Barnegat Bay Partnership 2/12/24 – 2/12/25)

- Becky is devoting time towards the BBP/OCSCD subcontract, "Jersey-Friendly Stewardship Certification Project". Tasks include: 1) develop and deliver age-appropriate lessons and activities on soil health and other JFY topics to participating students in at least 10 enrolled schools. Lessons and activities are designed to assist schools with meeting the requirements of the JFY School Certification Program. 2) Provide technical advice and support to at least 5 enrolled schools about the design and installation of JFY School Certification Program projects in their schoolyards; advise on issues related to soil health, plant selection, and wildlife habitat enhancement. OCSCD will provide a total of \$15,000 of billable services and \$15,000 of in-kind services to this project over the term of the subcontract.
  - Over the summer while schools are no longer in session, Becky is focusing on developing lessons to support Nellie Bennett Elementary School 5<sup>th</sup> Graders. Becky will be providing age-appropriate soil, water, plant and wildlife-focused lessons to support the implementation of a Pollinator Garden at Nellie Bennet Elementary School in the 2024/25 School Year.
  - Becky will continue communications with teachers from the following JFY-enrolled schools, including:
    - 1. Nellie Bennett Elementary School, Point Pleasant Borough
    - 2. Elms Elementary School, Jackson Twp
    - 3. Whiting Elementary School, Manchester Twp
    - 4. Manchester Twp Elementary School, Manchester Twp
    - 5. Central Regional High School, Berkeley Twp

## Grant 2: Lakewood Township Stormwater Basins Retrofit Project

OCSCD is partnering with South Jersey Resource Conservation and Development Council (SJRC&D) represented by Eileen Miller, Team Habitat Coordinator, the Camden County Soil Conservation District represented by Craig McGee, Director, and Lakewood Township Department of Public Works, on a grant from the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection: *Lakewood Township Stormwater Basin Retrofit Project*. The grant is funded by a Federal 319(h) Water Quality Restoration grant awarded by the NJ Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) to SJRC&D. Brittany Moore is the lead project coordinator on behalf of OCSCD and Becky Laboy is focusing primarily on the communications and education component. Jessica Pinto, Erosion Control Specialist, has also been attending meetings and is offering her time to support this project.

- Becky, Brittany and Jessica have met with the Lakewood Basin Retrofit Project Team to continue to plan our "Tour de' Basins". We are in the process of developing educational materials to bring awareness and knowledge to the public about the importance of the Basin Retrofit projects.
  - o "Tour de' Basins" will take place on **Thursday, October 3**rd, to showcase the retrofits of 3-6 basins, possibly including: John F. Patrick Sports Complex (to showcase the new Pollinator Garden), Rachel Court, Independence Court, Tuscany Court, First Energy/Blue Claws Stadium, American Ave.
  - OCSCD Inspectors are actively documenting vegetative growth with photos and video.
  - o Developing educational materials about basin types, healthy soil, decompaction, water infiltration, and appropriate native grasses and perennials for a Stormwater Basin Retrofit Project "toolkit".

# 2. (APO Item #4, Activity 2) Seeks Grants and Funding to support both on-going and new initiatives and programs:

Becky continues to research potential grants and opportunities that will support the District's Mission.

- A pollinator garden was installed at Common Grounds Community Garden in Lakewood Township on Thursday,
  May 30. Additional partners on this project included Lakewood Township Public Works and Lakewood Twp
  Police Department, with assistance in planting from School for Children with Hidden Intelligence and Mayaan
  Girls High School of Jackson. Brick Township Municipal Utilities Authority assisted with educational programing
  after the installation. See our Blog for the full story.
  - Funding for plants provided by Xerces Society for Invertebrate Conservation.
  - o 500 native plant plugs were supplied by Pinelands Nursery
  - Becky followed-up the planting with an outreach program, co-presented with Shari Kondrup from BTMUA, at the Common Grounds Community Garden; program topics included healthy soil and water conservation.

### (APO Item #5) EDUCATION INITIATIVES

- **1. (APO Item #5, Activity 1)** Becky maintains and enhances OCSCD's website to more effectively utilize and disseminate pertinent and educational resources and assist in fulfilling OCSCD Mission.
  - Sub-Task: Becky maintains the communications database & mailing/contact list for E&O initiatives. Constant Contact is the tool used to disseminate newsletters/updates, announcements, etc.

## Communications: Website, Newsletter, Blog, Social Media and Annual Report:

Becky has been using several OCSCD media communications platforms in an effort to engage a broader audience in support of the District's Mission. OCSCD staff have been regularly contributing articles for publication in OCSD's newsletter.

- 2. (APO Item #5, Activity 2) Becky maintains communications and networks with regional and statewide Conservation Education and Environmental Education partners, and is involved in several initiatives, including Barnegat Bay Roundtable Steering & Planning Committee, Barnegat Bay Estuary Program's Communication and Education Committee, Conservation Partnership meetings, Natural Resource Education Foundation of New Jersey (NREF), Jersey-Friendly Yards and the New Jersey Bay Islands Initiative.
  - Becky is representing OCSCD at the monthly <u>New Jersey Bay Islands Initiative (NJBII)</u> "Communications Working Group". Becky and Kristin Adams also attend monthly online meetings with all NJBII partners and constituents, led by Virginia Rettig, Edwin B. Forsythe NWR Manager, USFW.
  - Becky attended the NJBII annual Field Trip on June 4, which took place at Sedge Islands Natural Resource
    Education Center. The group focused on learning about sea level rise, erosion due to human activity and the
    effects of bay islands. A video will be produced from footage captured during the Field Trip, which will be used
    by the NJBII group in future public campaigns.
- **3.** (APO Item #5, Activity 3) Poster Contest: The winners for the 2024 Poster Contest were selected and can be viewed on OCSCD's <u>Annual NJ Conservation Poster Contest webpage</u>. The theme this year was: "May The Forest Be With You,

**Always**". OCSCD's Grand Champion Winner was Saoirse Parsons, Grade 10, New Egypt High School, who received a Certificate of Recognition and a \$50 check from OCSCD. First Place Winners were Abigail Scanlon, Grade 8, Veterans Memorial Middle School, and Abigail Alaimo, Grade 6, Veterans Memorial Middle School, who both received Certificates of Recognition.

- **4. (APO Item #5, Activity 4) Promote the Distribution of Low Maintenance Landscaping Guides.** Becky continues searching for grants to support funding to print additional LML Guides.
  - Several boxes of the Spanish version of the LML Guides were provided to BBP to be distributed alongside their new Spanish version of their Going Native brochure.
- **5. (APO Item #5, Activity 5) Barnegat Bay Environmental Educators Roundtable:** The BBEERT Steering Committee will be meeting virtually on Wednesday, July 31<sup>st</sup> to discuss plans for the 28<sup>th</sup> Annual Barnegat Bay Environmental Educators Roundtable, in 2025. - **6. (APO Item #5, Activity 6) Internship & Volunteer Opportunities and Agreements:** OCSCD now has a volunteer who will be assisting with Education & Outreach activities for the summer, from now until the first week in August. Sean Kelly, will assist Becky with several outreach programs, contribute an article/blog post to OCSCD's August newsletter, and provide assistance with social media. Sean's volunteer term will be short, as he will be going back to college in early August.
- 7. (APO Item #5, Activity 7) Becky offers a variety of Outreach Programs based on soil health & natural resources to various groups/organizations; at least 12 per year.

## 2024 E&O programs on the schedule:

- May 17: Becky presented a *Soil Assessment* workshop for **Point Pleasant Borough High School** AP Environmental Science students. The program was part of *Pollinator Point Environmental Sciences Symposium* developed and facilitated by the Point Pleasant Garden Club. It took place at the Point Pleasant Borough Municipal Complex, at the new Pollinator Point garden, founded in 2022 by the Point Pleasant Garden Club, and supported through participation in the Jersey Friendly Yards Municipal Certification Grant Program. (25 attendees)
- May 29: Becky presented a 45-minute webinar on "Soils 101" to the Barnegat Bay Partnership's Barnegat Bay Volunteer Master Naturalists. The program was an overview of soils and an introduction to some local soil series, including their properties and characteristics. The webinar was followed by an in-person workshop on May 31. (15 attendees)
- May 31: Becky provided an in-person workshop on local soils to the Barnegat Bay Partnership's Barnegat Bay
   Volunteer Master Naturalists at Wells Mills County Park. The group of 15 participants delved into soil properties
   through hands-on activities using soil sieves and NPK/pH tests, followed by trail walking to dig-up and examine the
   horizons of Manahawkin Muck and Downer soil series, along with identification of the vegetation associated with
   these two distinct soil series. (15 attendees)
- June 2: Becky provided a Healthy Soils & Water Conservation workshop, in collaboration with Shari Kondrup of the
  Brick Township Municipal Utilities Authority, for an audience at the Common Grounds Community Garden,
  Lakewood. Becky introduced participants to the local soil under the newly installed pollinator garden, demonstrated
  how to take a soil sample, and used sieves to determine the texture. Discussions related soil texture to water
  holding capacity and water conservation practices in the garden. (10 attendees)
- July 21: Becky will be providing a program, Healthy Soils, Healthy Gardens, hosted by Shari Kondrup of the Brick Township Municipal Utilities Authority, as part of BTMUA's "Weekends at the Reservoir" summer series. Currently, there are 20 participants signed-up. Becky will introduce participants to the properties of soil, the importance of healthy soil to a healthy garden, demonstrate how to collect a soil sample and have it tested at Rutgers Soil Testing Lab, then conduct a soil sieve test to determine the texture of the soil, and discuss how texture relates to water conservation and nutrient holding capacity. Becky will share BBP's Going Native resource and discuss the Jersey-Friendly Yards Resident Certification program.
- **July 23:** Becky will be providing a program *Soils 101* to children enrolled in **JCNERR**'s Children's Creature Feature summer series. Becky will introduce the kids to soil texture using the soil sieve sets, and sort through soil/compost

to look for and identify soil critters. Soil texture, organic matter, air and soil moisture will be discussed as important components of healthy soil and a healthy soil ecosystem.

- July 24: Becky will be providing a program Soils 101 to children enrolled in Long Beach Township Marine Education
  Field Station's summer education series. Becky will introduce the participants to soil texture using the soil sieve sets,
  and sort through soil/compost to look for and identify soil critters. Soil texture, organic matter, air and soil moisture
  will be discussed as important components of healthy soil and a healthy soil ecosystem.
- August 5: Becky will be providing a program Soils 101 to children enrolled in the Spray Beach Yacht Club's summer
  education series for sailors. Becky will introduce the participants to soil texture using the soil sieve sets, and sort
  through soil/compost to look for and identify soil critters. Soil texture, organic matter, air and soil moisture will be
  discussed as important components of healthy soil and a healthy soil ecosystem.
- **September 14:** Becky will be one of several workshop presenters at this year's **Jersey-Friendly Yards Conference**. Becky will present *Soil Assessment: understanding your soil's health*. The 45-minute workshop will include assessments of texture, NPK and pH. It will be presented twice, in rotation.
- September 24: Becky will be providing a program *Soils 101* to Arc of Ocean County participants. Becky will introduce the participants to soil texture using the soil sieve sets, and sort through soil/compost to look for and identify soil critters. Soil texture, organic matter, air and soil moisture will be discussed as important components of healthy soil and a healthy soil ecosystem.
- **8. (APO Item #5, Activity 8) Envirothon:** The NJ Envirothon will took place on Saturday, May 18, at Big Brook Park in Marlboro. The 2024 National Envirothon "Current Issue" topic was: *Renewable Energy for a Sustainable Future*. Becky co-coordinated the Wildlife Station with Holly Reynolds from Freehold Soil Conservation District. Two Barnegat Bay Master Naturalists assisted with the Wildlife Station this year. Our hometown school, MATES, won First Place, and will be representing New Jersey at the National Envirothon in New York, which takes place from July 28-August 3.
